- Mud Resist Indigo Block Print Workshop in Bagru
- Block Print Workshop in Jaipur
- Cooking class in Orchha with a local family
- Cooking class in Varanasi with a local family

Visit to a family business in Varanasi that weaves the famous Varanasi silk saris and scarves on hand looms.

Throughout the trip we focus on traditional craftsmanship at monuments, temples and forts, reflecting the Indian spirit.

We print a scarf with this technique and get an insight into a traditional family business in this town, which is a few kilometres outside of Jaipur.

All films are in Hindi and last about 3 hours.

You will never forget, because it is like a fairground.

There is applause, babies scream, phones ring, etc.

In the morning we first visit the Amer Fort in Jaipur.


The famous Block Print Museum Anokhi is our next stop.



In the evening we reach Agra.





Sunday 5.October Orchha

Tuesday 7.October Khajuraho - Varanasi (9hours travel time)

A full day's journey takes us to Varanasi, the holiest city in India, on the river Ganges in the state of Uttar Pradesh.

Varanasi is considered to be the city of the god Shiva and is a desirable destination for devout Hindus.

Once in a lifetime to bathe in the river, and once in a lifetime to die and be cremated there.

Along the river are kilometres of stairways, the ghats.

On one side the devotees bathe and a few metres away the bodies of the deceased are cremated.

Thursday 9. October full day Varanasi and in the evening we take the night train back to New Delhi.

In the morning we check out of the hotel.

We can leave the luggage in our bus until the evening.

We visit a local family business that weaves the famous Varanasi silk saris and scarves on handlooms.

In the evening our chauffeur takes us to the railway station and we travel back to New Delhi on a night train with reclining beds.


In the morning we arrive at New Delhi Railway Station.

10. October End of our service.

If your flight is late in the evening and you would like a hotel room, we can arrange this for you.

(with surcharge, can also be decided spontaneously during the trip).

Alternatively, you can leave your luggage at our travel agency at Connaught Place during the day until your departure and explore the city centre around Connaught Place Circle.

Read everything carefully, it's a bit of a filler, but no witchcraft.

The most important thing is the photo you have to take.

50mm x 50mm, they take that exactly and please don't smile, close your mouth, hair behind your ears, no shadows on your face, the background has to be white neutral. (i.e. not in front of a wooden wall or wallpaper).

Once you have paid and sent the form (via e-mail) you will receive confirmation after approx. 24-48 hours, normally after 3 days at the latest.

Print it out and take it with you.

First-aid kit

In an emergency, everything is available in India, but would take the following products:

- Betadine small bottle
 - plaster
 - Paracetamol tablets or similar (against pain in general)
 - Immodium (against diarrhoea)
 - or possibly charcoal tablets (against diarrhoea)
 - Motilium (nausea and vomiting or something similar, ask in the pharmacy)
 - Mosquito spray, also available in India.
 - Anti-allergic for local treatment/soothing of itching from insect bites, minor burns and sunburn.
 - Tampon, not available everywhere in India.
 - Probiotics for travel, I highly recommend for India. There are various products. Ask at the pharmacy or drugstore. Start taking them 2 days before departure.
 - Medication for travel sickness, for those who get sick quickly when driving.
- VACCINATION: BE SURE TO ASK THE DOCTOR.

Suitcases and hand luggage

It rumbles a lot and the suitcases are usually transported on the roof, so I wouldn't take a designer item. If you are taking special medicines or ointments, I would plan to take them in your hand luggage (in India, not in the flight).
ps. If you have them in your suitcase, they may spoil due to the heat on the roof. As hand luggage for travelling, take a bag that you can tuck under your arms (not a backpack, as thieves can get inside very quickly).

Money

The easiest way is to take cash with you.
Cash withdrawals at ATMs are possible with Postcard, Maestro, Visa ect. but only small amounts can be withdrawn per time.
Per transfer 10 000 Rupees (and costs each time).
Credit card payments are usually only possible in larger shops.

Clothes

Airy long trousers and T-shirts half-length.
Light jacket and possibly a few long blouses.
Off-the-shoulder shirts and shorts should be avoided.

Swimming costume: Some hotels have a swimming pool.
Laundry service is available in all hotels

Arrival Delhi

Depending on how many people are arriving, it can take a while to get through passport control.

It can take anywhere from a few minutes to an hour.

In the airport (at the baggage claim there are possibilities to change money).

If at all, I would only change a little at the airport (max. Fr 50.00).

I or Sunil can change money for you on the first day if you want.

When you come through the green exit (duty free), many Indians (behind a long metal barrier) are already waiting for their guests, including us with a sign board of Maasa India Tourism with your name.

Go out to the left side, if we don't see you or you don't see us, wait at the coffee snack stand. It's just past the left exit, still in the concourse.

Don't go all the way out of the airport building, once you're outside you won't be able to get back in.

SIM Card

We can organise an Indian SIM card for you.

We need a copy of your passport and visa.

Tip

It is customary in India to tip, for example, when a hotel employee brings your luggage to your room, when you order food or tea to your room, etc. At the end of the trip, our bus driver should also receive a tip. **We will inform you on the spot about appropriate tips (approx. 500 Rs. per day/person for the driver).**

Beggar

This can be a challenge for a first trip to India. It is a nice gesture to give money to old or disabled people. Such people do not have an intact family to support them. Children should not be given money.

The parents of begging children should not be given an incentive to send them to the streets, but to enable them to get an education.
